
Our approach




Definition: Community granting

- A responsibility of the community foundation to serve the needs of the community through the distribution of grants via a transparent and accessible process.
- A granting process that is trust-based and centered around engagement with organizations who are eligible to apply for grants.



- Demonstrates the relevance of your community foundation to the broader community.
- Strengthens community connections and relationships (donors, grantees).
- Builds a more robust network of communityserving organizations.
- Provides the best community value with the available granting funds.

How might you adapt your response?



- Seek to understand the needs of your community.
 - Community research and consultations.
 - Develop "deep community knowledge" within your foundation.
- Build relationships with grant-eligible organizations.
 - Who are they? What are their needs?
 - How will the grant support their work?
 - Why does their work matter to us? To our community?

(Move from the transactional to the relational)



- Manage the real AND perceived "power dynamic" between community foundations and grant applicants.
 - Approach the work from a place of humility, compassion, and gratitude towards the community-serving organizations.
 - View the foundation's role as a partner while balancing the need to do "due diligence" on the funds disbursed.



- Grants that address the **needs** of the community, as **defined** by the community.
- An accessible and collaborative grants application process.
- The establishment of a **peer-to-peer** relationship between your foundation and the service organizations in your community.


